# **Sacred Connections**

# Dear Friends,

This month I was supposed to be traveling to Israel to celebrate Israel's 75th birthday on a bus filled Temple Beth Sholom congregants and Jews from across Miami. This is a trip that could hardly have been imagined by our relatives only a few generations ago. I think that even Herzl himself could not have predicted the breathtaking trajectory of success our young nation has achieved, from the prodigious number of inventions to astounding military victories and humanitarian and cultural contributions.

However, as the Yiddish expressions goes: "Humans plan and God laughs." Unfortunately, and perhaps even ironically, I had to cancel because of challenges I have had with my left foot since my last trip to Israel this past summer, when I fractured my foot teaching Israeli dancing! Despite my inability to join in, I am proud that our GMJF Mission will once again will be the largest delegation of the entire diaspora in Israel for Yom Ha'Atzma'ut (Israel's Independence Day). I have lost count of the number of times I have had the privilege of visiting Israel. I have lived there on two separate occasions and I will be going yet again in June with our Temple Beth Sholom B'Yachad Trip.

I am an unabashed Zionist. I even represented Reform Judaism at the last World Zionist Congress where I was an official delegate. Yet, even still, Israel's current governing coalition, the most far-right in Israel's history, led by Benjamin Netanyahu, is causing me and many of you (and hundreds of thousands of Israelis who are protesting in the streets) great distress.

Despite my grave misgivings about Israel's new coalition government, I know that this is not the time to abandon Israel. Instead, I am sharing my concerns with those in positions of power and working to modify the illiberal forces that are trying to reshape Israel.

Many of you have shared your concerns with me too:

- We are concerned about the collapse of democracy if the proposed changes to Israel's Supreme Court are passed, disabling the Supreme Court from serving as a check on the unrestrained power of the legislature.
- We are concerned about Israel changing provisions in the Law of Return which has existed since 1950, and which until now granted citizenship to anyone with one Jewish grandparent (1970), or who has converted to Judaism under non-Orthodox auspices. These changes would nullify the grandparent clause and render a good percent of our congregation ineligible for Israeli citizenship under the Law of Return.

- We are concerned that non-Orthodox Jews in Israel at such thriving congregations as our partner synagogue in Jerusalem, Kehilat HaDror, will be defunded by the government as threatened in the coalition agreement, in favor of greater support for the Haredi ultra-Orthodox population.
- We are concerned that this government includes racist and extremist factions that put the rights of women, LGBTQ Jews, Israeli Arabs and the future of the two-state solution at risk.

While it's true that we do not live in Israel and cannot vote there, it's also true that Israel is the Jewish homeland for all Jews everywhere, and what happens there affects the entire Jewish world.

I repeat, this is not the time to abandon Israel; rather it is the time to protest these non-democratic policies and support a democratic and pluralistic Jewish State. Here is one way you can help:

• Donate to Israel's Movement for Progressive Judaism to raise 1.5 million dollars to help offset a potential loss of funding to Reform Jews in Israel. We will continue to monitor the situation in Israel and share information about how you can financially and ideologically support a pluralistic and democratic Israel.

Thank you to all of you who have showed up for Israel again and again. Now is the time to show up in a different way.

Every Passover we conclude our Seders with the words, "Next year in Jerusalem." This year, let us pray and work for the Jerusalem envisioned in Israel's Declaration of Independence in 1948: "The State of Israel will.... foster the development of the country for the benefit of all its inhabitants; it will be based on freedom, justice and peace as envisaged by the prophets of Israel; it will ensure complete equality of social and political rights to all its inhabitants irrespective of religion, race or sex; it will guarantee freedom of religion, conscience, language, education and culture; it will safeguard the Holy Places of all religions...."

# Dear Families,

I am getting ready to graduate this May, with my second master's degree from Hebrew Union College (HUC). I earned my first educational master's degree back in 1992 and now, at the age of 68, I am excited to have earned my Executive Masters in Jewish Education. Much of my course work over the last two years has highlighted how our Innovative School professionals are truly a professional community of life-long learners. I have shared about how we continually ask ourselves questions like: What does it mean to be on an individual and communal professional journey? What does it mean to leave a place of professional comfort? Where do we journey to and what guides us along our journey?

We are on our journey, and it is one that had a beginning but hopefully will not have an end. Our process of journeying has strengthened our relationships and is maximizing our synergistic energy.

I would like to share an excerpt taken from Margaret Wheatley and Myron Kellner-Roger's work, "A Simpler Way," page 88:

Life is in motion, "becoming becoming." The motions of life swirl inward to the creating of self and outward to the creating of the world. We turn inward to bring forth self. Then the self extends outward, seeking other, joining together. Systems arise. Extension and desire organize into complex and meaningful forms.

Life takes form from such ceaseless motions. But the motions of life have direction. Life moves toward life. We seek for connection and restore the world to wholeness. Our seemingly separate lives become meaningful as we discover how necessary we are to each other. Meaning expands as we join life's cohering motions. Meaning deepens as we move into the dance.

When do we feel most amazed? What fosters this awakening? When do we feel grateful and what is our response? How can we better see the ordinary moments as extraordinary moments? How do we cultivate, as a community, an attitude of openness, of joy, of doubt, of excitement, of awe, and of gratitude? Can we create the sacred time and sacred space for these deep emotional experiences to happen?

# Margie



Freedom has been a particularly salient theme over the past year.

I woke up on the morning of June 25, 2022 having fewer rights than I ever had in my lifetime, thanks to the Supreme Court decision regarding Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Heath. Living in a country that prides itself on the ideals of freedom and liberty, it was difficult to comprehend how mine had just been diminished.

I went for a very long walk that morning, and found myself at the site of the Champlain Towers South in Surfside, one year and one day after it collapsed without warning. The residents there had gone to sleep one night thinking that they had the freedom to be safe in their homes, only for that to be shattered in an instant.

I sat with these things for a long while, trying to make sense of a world where sense did not seem to exist anymore. I was not successful.

And then, just a few weeks ago, the news broke of a shooting on the campus of Michigan State University - my alma mater. I had classes in the academic building where the violence began. I hung out in the Student Union where there were more victims. I reflected on my memories of these spaces and thought about how I walked through campus with a sense of freedom, not a sense of fear. The four years I spent at MSU were some of the best of my life, and while we certainly were taught to be aware of our surroundings and to be careful at parties, the thought never crossed my mind that I would have needed to know how to shelter in place for anything other than a possible tornado.

For context, I graduated about 11 months prior to the Columbine school shooting.

Freedom is fleeting. It is not guaranteed. It is something we constantly need to fight for, and then continually fight to hang onto it once we have it. When we become complacent, freedom disappears.

This is a lesson from the story of the Israelites that perhaps we do not focus on as much as we should. At our Pesach seder, we celebrate our story of freedom and redemption. But we do not talk about what came next - the journey to learn how to live with that freedom, and what that entailed.

It is no accident that we commemorate our story with a "seder," which translates to "order" in English. For freedom does not mean that we can do whatever we want. To truly be free, we need to have boundaries, and live within those boundaries to feel comfortable and safe. The real story of the Israelites is how they figured out how to do that, which was not without strife – this is why it took them 40 years to make it to the Promised Land. And while we sometimes joke about just how many rules there are in Judaism (613, to be exact!), these are the guidelines by which we can remain a cohesive, free people. The seder is an orderly ritual that models the way in which we should create the paradox of freedom through structure.

There should be laws in our society that allow people to live without fear; a life without safety is a life without freedom. We should be safe in our homes and in our communities. The limits that keep us safe allow us to be free. This is a great lesson for our children to start to understand as we retell the story of our people and as we live our daily lives. May we seek our perpetual redemption as we work toward a society in which we can truly be free.





Beyond the classroom, she has been fortunate enough to be able to support many educational programs and innovative endeavors ranging from early childhood, to Hillel programs on college campuses, to supporting teacher training and parenting courses at the University of Haifa, as well as seed monies to launch Shalom Baby at TBS. Her brother Morrisz<sup>\*\*</sup> and his wife Anita are long time members and benefactors. Ann's son John and his family are TBS members, and John served on the TBS board from 2014-20.

In recognition of the fact that both TBS and education have played major roles in the lives of the Broad Bussel family, the **Broad Bussel Educational Enhancement Fund was** created in 2013 to support unbudgeted educational initiatives at our School for Living Judaism (jLAB) and has been expanded to include other areas for

our Youth, such as BESHTY travel experiences. Past programs created with this fund have ranged from the Shabbat Experience, to a Madrichim Program, to bringing in an Artist-in-Residence. Fast forward to today and the fund currently helps support our jLAB technology needs, Coding & Robotics classes, and more, as well as BESHTY trips to advocate in Washington, D.C. and explore Jewish history in NYC.

The Broad Bussel family wants to see these efforts live on for generations to come so that TBS can continue to be for others what it has been for them.
