Additionally, Margie coined the KEHILA Approach of learning with values of Kindness, Empathy, Honesty, Integrity and Life-long learning; and truly breathed life into these values prized at our Innovative School.

These are just some of the ways that Margie will leave her inimitable loving, passionate, exuberant mark on not only our school, but also on our TBS world. I am grateful that she will continue to guide us as she

helps to mentor our very talented new Early Childhood Director, Jen Katz Burk, and our amazing Head of School, Stacy Penson. Margie, we are thrilled to celebrate you and all your pioneering accomplishments early this month. Thank you for your lifetime career devoted to championing our dear children and helping to give educators and parents the tools to support and raise them to be their best selves. We love you.

Social Justice

This past year has been filled with many wonderful social justice programs which engaged hundreds of our Temple Beth Sholom members, as we worked to strengthen our local community. At the same time, our hearts are still with the people of Israel after the October 7th attacks and the continued rise in antisemitism at home and abroad.

This year we worked hard on Amendment 4 in Florida. Although we ultimately did not reach the 60% threshold to approve, Amendment 4 received over 57% approval, demonstrating that most Floridians want less restrictive reproductive rights laws. TBS is proud to have worked with the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism - Florida and other partners on this grass-roots campaign. Special thanks to Myra Spindel, Barbara Gelber, and Dr. Robin Straus, and the entire volunteer team who collected petitions, made phone calls and texts, knocked on doors, and mobilized our community.

Of course, the crowning jewel of our work was Mitzvah Day and the Soup Contest. We had 30+ projects and over 500 people participating to better our community. The Soup Contest had 14 chefs and raised over \$5,000 for the Miami Beach Holocaust Memorial and Teen Blue Card Fund to support Holocaust Survivors.

Special thanks to our leaders, Andrea Wagner and Rachel Unger, our Social Justice Network Co-chairs; Shelby Kempler and Caryn Pardo, our Mitzvah Day Co-chairs; and Karen Sepsenwol, Dana Grodin and Jody Gross, our Soup Contest Co-chairs.

Here are important dates for 2025-26:

Social Justice Network meetings: September 9, December 10, March 10, and May 13.

30th Annual Mitzvah Day and Soup Contest: February 22, 2026.

Our work in the Social Justice Network is determined by the voice of the congregation and our partnerships with valued allies. This spring our SJN held a listening campaign, where we asked members of the congregation, "What's keeping you up at night?" After a vote, Food Insecurity was selected as our next SJN topic of the year. That means that in the coming year food insecurity work will permeate our temple and school through direct service, advocacy, and education. Currently our Food Insecurity research team is working to determine the best course of action to fight hunger and choose local partners with whom we will work.

We are lucky that we also will have opportunities to get involved in housing and immigration work due to two incredible partnerships.

PACT, our interfaith community organizing coalition, continued to prioritize affordable housing this year and just accomplished some major wins at Nehemiah Action. We secured three million dollars in additional county funding for an existing eviction diversion program. This work is far from over and PACT is always looking for more members who wish to get involved.

Our partners at the Religious Action Center of Florida have also chosen to prioritize fighting for immigrants and refugees in our state. In January, Florida passed legislation setting aside half a billion dollars of state funding to crack down on immigrants. We just read at our Passover seders, "My father was a wandering Aramean," in recognition that as Jews we have all been wanderers before. Each of us can trace our story back to ancestors seeking refuge. We hope to ensure the safety and security of those coming to America to seek protection from harm and a better life.

Banned Book of the Month




Book: Speak

Reason Banned: Sexual content, profanity, violence

Published in 1999, *Speak* is a novel by Laurie Halse Anderson based on her personal experience with sexual assault as a teenager. In *Speak*, the main character, Melinda, finds herself nearly mute after being raped at a school party before her freshman year. The book follows Melinda as she navigates challenging high school social dynamics, while rediscovering her voice through art and expression. Melinda eventually finds her voice and shares about her assault with her art teacher. *Speak* is currently Banned Pending Investigation through Administration and Formal Challenges in multiple counties in Florida (and other states) due to sexual content.

Each month the TBS Freedom to Read task force will feature one of over 3,000 books banned in the state of Florida. Book bans are defined as any action taken against a book by a parent, community member, school administration or government official. Bans may result in permanent or temporary removal from school or library shelves. While South Florida counties have very few book bans, Florida leads the nation in books being challenged and banned in schools. I believe that this shared experience is the connective tissue of our group — the bond that has yielded meaningful discussions and, at times, surprisingly poignant moments of intimacy.



Welcome to another in our series exploring the volunteer experiences of our Temple Beth Sholom members in Israel after October 7, 2023.

My Volunteer Experience in Israel by Malka Mordujovich

Walking home after participating in the "Shabbat of the Empty Chair" for the hostages at Temple Beth Sholom in November of 2023, I kept thinking: "How can I help?" By the time I arrived home, my heart made my decision for me: "I have to return to Israel."

On December 7, 2023, I was on an EL-AL plane, on my way to Eretz Yisrael. Walking in the mostly empty Ben-Gurion airport, with pictures of all the hostages, I knew I had made the right decision. My "headquarters" for my stay was the Arts Hotel on Ben-Yehuda St. in Tel-Aviv. I registered with LEKET (The Israel National Food Bank); two days after my arrival, I was behind the Habima Theater, waiting for the bus to take all the volunteers to the South (Gaza Envelope). It was very dark, with no bus, no volunteers yet. At 5:36 AM, the bus came, volunteers started to arrive, and my heart went from trepidation to positive excitement, as my days of being a farmer began.

I spent every day at a different Moshav (Eitan, Ami-Oz, Mivtahim, Tkuma, Shuva, etc.) harvesting oranges, cucumbers, cherry tomatoes, and lemons (glorious fragrance, scratchy arms). I planted garlic for 6 hours, and unable to remove the smell of garlic from myself, I decided the next day to help cook for the soldiers at a Chabad in Tel Aviv. Again, I arrived early, before they were ready for the volunteers, and I asked the Italian cook if I could be of help until they were ready. What did they give me? A whole box of garlic to chop!! Eventually, I was tasked with peeling potatoes, carrots and avocados, and chopping cucumbers and tomatoes. But Tamara, the Italian cook, kept bringing me more garlic to chop!

After a month of work, I felt so enriched, knowing I had received so much more than I had given. I had the full Israel post-October 7 experience: several alarm sirens, Saturdays at the demonstrations in *Kikar-Hatufim* (Hostage Square) in Tel Aviv, and sharing the hotel, meals and stories with refugees from Kiryat Shmona. I felt enormous gratitude from the Israelis, just for this little grain of solidarity that I was privileged to offer them.

This was the experience of a lifetime that I will never forget.
